PORNOGRAPHIC IMAGES

The pornographic images were not for public viewing, but were kept in secret boxes, pockets, and sometimes even down the arms of a coat. When no police officers were to be seen and a young man or boy was nearby, a businessman called the potential buyer aside, showed a picture and offered to sell it. In the late 1920s, a pan-European pornographic production and distribution business was set up in Estonia, creating a major headache for the authorities. Ned de Baggo, who was the founder of the business, could be given the title of Estonian King of Porn.
